accomplishment for Animal Folks in 2021 was the creation of an animal cruelty chapter for the Minnesota Judges Criminal Benchbook, 7th Edition. Research and writing of this chapter was in 2020 and 2021; final draft was formatted and published by Minnesota Continuing Legal Education (Minn. CLE) in 2021. Animal Folks convened a team of four authors to write this chapter, focusing on Minnesota animal cruelty laws, legal precedent, and related issues. The benchbook is used by judges and prosecutors while conducting legal research on Minnesota criminal laws and related issues. Animal Cruelty Training for Veterinary Students - Ongoing: For the second year, Animal Folks worked with veterinarians at the University of Minnesota to teach senior veterinary students about animal cruelty and how to report suspected. Once licensed, these students will become mandated reporters. Animal Cruelty Training for Veterinarians - Ongoing: For the seventh year, Animal Folks partnered with the Minnesota Veterinary Medical Association (MVMA) to host a training session at the MVMA annual meeting in February on how to identify, document and report animal cruelty. Animal Folks collaborated with the ASPCA Senior Director of Veterinary Forensics to present this session. Due to COVID, this format was online.
